• • • GROUP and BEST IN SHOW JUDGES • • •

Toy Group — Jenny Miller: In 1964 I started showing an English Springer Spaniel given to me from the Pencloe kennel, and then continuing with another gift to breeding my own line under the affix Feorlig. Then the introduction of German Shepherd Dogs, Skye Terriers, Cocker Spaniels and with my son and daughter have introduced Bassett Hounds, Papillons, King Charles Spaniels and Cavaliers King Charles Spaniels plus one Irish Setter. I have made up 16 English Springers, 5 Skye Terriers and 5 Papillons. I also have many others with CCs, RCCs, ShCM and Junior Warrants.

I now judge majority of the Gundog Breeds within the group with exception of the 3 breeds. I also award CCs in Pastoral, Terrier, Toy and Utility Breeds. I have been lucky to be invited to judge both English Springer and Skye Terrier breeds at Crufts which was such an honour and lovely memory. I have judged in most of Europe and all of Scandinavia, Australia and New Zealand, in several African Countries and Barbados.

I am so looking forward to returning to judge at Thame Show where I showed every year and to be judging your lovely dogs.

Gundog Group — Colin Woodward: In 1975 I started showing English Springer Spaniels. My first dog made up in 1979 was Sh Ch Barlochan Engineer. Our foundation Bitch came from the Feorlig Kennel.

Several Show Champions followed under my wife's affix Wadeson, including the current Breed Record holder Sh Ch Wadeson Inspector Wexford.

I started judging at Open Show level in the late 70s leading to English Springer Spaniels at Driffield Championship Show in the mid 80s.

I now award CCs in the UK to all the Spaniel Breeds plus GSP, Weimaraner, Pointer, IRWS, Large Munsterlander and Bracco. I have a keen interest in all breeds of dogs.

I have judged in Spain, Sweden, Norway, Finland, Ireland and Malta.

Hound Group — Hilary Tringham: I grew up around the ringside with parents that bred and showed Min and Toy Poodles. My parents bred a Min Poodle that went BIS at Birmingham National in what in those days was a record entry. I followed in their footsteps with my Afghan Hounds under the Kushbudar prefix. We owned Britain's first all black male Champion whose son was the second and his grandson the third. This is my 48th year with Afghans by my side.

I came up through the Breed Club judging system and was approved to give CCs in the 70s. Recently I have judged the Hound Group at the Ilfracombe Open Show and Stakes classes at Olympia Washington State.

My thanks to the committee for the opportunity to judge at Thame and Oxfordshire's Autumn show. I am looking forward to the appointment.

Pastoral Group — Kevin Young: It gives me great pleasure to judge at Thames & Oxford CS where I am looking forward to judge the Pastoral group. I first became involved in showing dogs in 1973 and my first judging appointment was in 1981. I had some success making up several Bearded Collie champions and winning green cards with Rough Collies and Boxers.

I had the honour to judge Bearded Collies at Crufts in 2001 and to date I award CCs in 33 breeds. I had much pleasure in judging those breeds in many parts of the world.

Utility Group — Vanessa Williams-Wegmann: Had her first Shih Tzu in 1980 and was immediately hooked. Her affix is Essvana. Her first Open Show judging appointment was in 1987. Vanessa has a wide interest in many breeds both as a Judge and Exhibitor. A former General Open Show Secretary and former Ringcraft Secretary.

Vanessa has owned and shown a variety of breeds: Boston Terrier, GSD, Great Dane, Rottweiler, Dobermann, Akita, Shih Tzu, Irish Wolfhound, Chihuahua and Miniature Pinscher and has obtained Stud Book Numbers, CCs, RCCs and Junior Warrant.

Is very proud to have a Shih Tzu Champion in 2012. Vanessa has a wide interest in varying breeds of dogs, is passed to award Challenge Certificates in 12 Breeds plus the Utility Group at Championship Shows. She has judged all over the UK, Channel Islands, Ireland and Europe.

Married to Peter Wegmann from Schffhausen Switzerland, residing in rural Gloucestershire where she and her husband Peter recently trained NH Racehorses. Vanessa is the hectic and proud mother of 9 year old Henry. Vanessa's dog showing/judging are an important part in her life but she is a busy bee and hobbies include learning to play the violin, drama, singing, reading, zumba, gym and aerobics, a bit of sailing, gardening, swimming, horse riding, ski-ing, ice-skating, playing scrabble and shopping for shoes!

Working Group — Jeanne Walker: My affix is Baikel. I was introduced to showing in 1985 with my first Dobermann bought solely as a pet. I then decided I enjoyed showing so booked a show puppy. I judged my first show about 1991, and now award CCs in Dobermanns.

I have judged other breeds and Working Groups. I ran a successful Ringcraft for 25 yrs and learned an awful lot about most breeds.

I have shown many breeds over the years for friends, and I am also on the Rhodesian Ridgeback Club of Great Britain C list.

I now own a Korthals Griffon on the Import Register (Gundog) who I am having fun with.

Terrier Group — Bev O'Neil: I first started showing in 1987 with Manchester Terriers, going on to breed my first litter in 1989 with my first homebred Champion Ch Megllan Jack of All Trades – going onto win 12 CCs, I have since bred several other Champions and CC winners. I have worked in Rescue and The Blue Cross also doing Breed Welfare for 25 yrs retiring from this recently. I give CCs in Manchester Terriers and I judged the Manchester Terrier Club Show in 2007. I enjoy judging all Terriers and have enjoyed judging a few Terrier Groups, I am delighted to be judging this group at Thame & Oxfordshire County Canine Society.

Best in Show Judge — Ronnie Irving: Ronnie Irving is a third-generation breeder of Border Terriers and he and his wife have produced 22 UK champions in the breed.

He first awarded Kennel Club Challenge Certificates in 1967 and is approved at Championship Show level in the UK to judge the Terrier Group, the Pastoral Group and Best in Show - which he has been judging at that level since 1986.

He has judged extensively in many European countries, and in the United States and Australasia and was the judge of Best in Show at Crufts in 2015.

He was Chairman of the Kennel Club from 2002 until he retired from that position in 2011. Since then he has started again writing regular columns in the Our Dogs magazine here in the UK and in Dog News in the USA

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all their judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry Fees: Non-Members: £6.00 First entry per dog; £2.00 each Subsequent Class with the same dog; Members: £5.00 First entry per dog; £2.00 each Subsequent Class with the same dog. Stakes Classes: £2.00 per class. Handling Classes: £2.00 per class. Obedience: £20.00 per team (£5.00 per dog) - **entries MUST be made by post**. Not for Competition £1.00 per dog. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries ONLY; THERE WILL BE NO CATALOGUES ON SALE ON THE DAY (*Pre-paid catalogues must be collected by 12 noon*). Membership: £3.00 Single; £4.00 Joint. Rosette Sponsorship: £4.00 per class; £3.00 per BOB/RBOB/BP.
7. Prize Money: BIS £100.00; RBIS £25.00; BPIS £25.00; RBPIS £10.00.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show: From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in show competitions are suspended.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a puppy it will should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group and Best in Show respectively.
 - a. Show Judged on the Group System
 - 1) Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Group placings must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - 2) Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.
 - b. Withdrawal from Competition Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes and Best Puppy in Breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety (AV) Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
 - c. Proviso For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **Best in Show: From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in show competitions are suspended.** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.
 - a. Shows Judged on the Group System: (Definition; Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulation B(A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show.)
 - 1) *Best of Breed:* Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

- 2) *Best of Group*: From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in show competitions are suspended. Best of group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-
 - a) The Best of Breed winners in each group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs.
 - b) The best unbeaten winning dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
- 3) *Best in Show*: From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to compete in the group or best in show competitions are suspended. Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
- b. *Withdrawal from other Competition*: Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group or Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
- c. *Proviso*: For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F I I.
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F I I.
16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
17. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days**. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

19. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
20. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
21. Should any Judge be prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge or Judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees can be returned.
22. The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
23. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
24. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
25. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
26. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
27. Entry fees will not be refunded in any circumstance.
28. There will be limited indoor wet weather facilities and limited chairs.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Tuesday, 15th August 2017**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes (excluding AVNSC classes) unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this Regulation are: From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class have been suspended.

- (1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- (2) A dog in Any Variety Field Trial or Working Trial Class.
- (3) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class.
- (4) A dog in Any Variety Champion Class.
- (5) As provided in Kennel Club Definitions of Classes.
- (6) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.
- (7) A dog in Good Citizen Scheme Classes.
- (8) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed Judge..

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) *Withdrawal* The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) *Transfer*
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or

height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

CHAMPION STAKES For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial Champion.

VETERAN STAKES For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

MEMBERS' OPEN WINE STAKES For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show, but restricted to fully paid-up members of Thame & Oxfordshire County Canine Society.

YKC MEMBERS' HANDLING CLASSES Only dogs of six (6) calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for entry into an YKC qualifying class. Dogs DO NOT NEED to be entered into a breed class to participate in an YKC Handling class at a championship or open show. Any dog entered in handling only classes is not eligible to be shown in a breed/AVNSC/Variety/Stakes class at the show or compete for the Group, Best in Show or Best Puppy in Show. The FIRST placed handler only in each age group at the qualifying show will qualify for Crufts. A rosette is awarded to the first place winner. This is not a roll down competition. Handling qualifiers run from the 1st January to the 31st December for the following year's Crufts. If a member is disqualified, the qualification does not roll down to the next placing. Classes for handling are decided by the handler's age. The classes are divided into three age groups: 6-11 years (6 years and up to, but not including 12th birthday); 12-16 years (12 years and up to, but not including 17th birthday); 17-24 years (17 years and up to, but not including 25th birthday). In order to enter any YKC competition, you must be a fully paid up member at the time of entry and competition. If you enter a Crufts qualifier and you have not previously paid your membership fee then any award will be forfeited. Therefore it is important to renew and maintain YKC membership as current if you wish to participate in YKC competitions.

IMPORTED REGISTER For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, and are ineligible for any other competition whatsoever.

SPECIAL YEARLING For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
